During the recent Juneteenth flag-raising, Mayor Ferrell introduced Maisha Barnett, a Seattle resident whose great-grandfather, John Conna, served as Sergeant At Arms for the first Washington State Legislature in 1889 and owned land in Federal Way. The City of Federal Way and Conna family representatives are working on renaming Alderbrook Park to Conna Park in honor of the family's legacy. In October 2023, Mayor Ferrell and our City Council supported the unveiling ceremony, pictured below, of the Conna family's photo mural at the bus shelter at 1157 S. 320th Street in Federal Way.



FWPD CONNECTS WITH OUR COMMUNITY YOUTH THROUGH ITS 'POSITIVE TICKETS PROGRAM'



The Positive Tickets Program is a youth-based initiative to build a trusting relationship between the police and young people. It complements the Federal Way Police Department's Community-Oriented Policing efforts to "earn the public's trust," with a particular focus on young adults in our community.

The program's concept is simple: Instead of catching kids doing something wrong, **police officers catch them doing something right!** The idea is that by building trusting relationships with local youth, police officers can prevent crime and human tragedy by helping them make positive choices.

By proactively identifying and recognizing positive behavior in our young adults, police officers can become valuable assets in their lives and help reinforce positive youth development.

The program aims to change existing paradigms and create new ones that inspire trust and respect. Instead of issuing violations for negative behavior, police officers "catch" kids doing good things and reward them with a Positive Ticket. The program requires a partnership with individuals, businesses, and the community to acquire ticket items such as food, movies, or entrances to fun events, providing an excellent alternative for kids!

The Police Department thanks **Wild Waves and Chick-fil-A** for partnering to make a positive difference in the lives of our local youth. Other businesses in the community who want to participate are encouraged to contact the FWPD.

The kids can receive tickets for positive behaviors such as practicing personal safety, doing good deeds, participating in community activities, volunteering, demonstrating community pride, and being role models for others!




