Two individuals had tampered with the sign, but Officer Wong quickly responded, disabled it, and secured it.

Congratulations to Officer Wong on his exemplary judgment and dedication to keeping the residents of Federal Way safe.

We thank Officer Wong for his sense of urgency and excellent work.

The Mayor's Commendation goes as follows:

Tonight, we honor an individual whose swift and decisive action symbolizes the City's long-standing zero-tolerance policy against racism. Within nine minutes of the sign being reported, Officer Nick Wong of the Federal Way Police Department arrived on scene and disabled the sign.

Not only did he immediately remove the power source, he went to Walmart, bought a lock, and installed it on the sign. He didn't know whose sign it was; he just knew it displayed a hateful message and that he needed to do everything in his power to squash it.

Alongside the Mayor, City Council, and good people of Federal Way, Officer Wong has zero tolerance for racist behavior. Because of his exemplary service, we honor him tonight with a Commendation for going above and beyond the line of duty to represent everything that is good in our community.
