EYES ON FEDERAL WAY EXCEEDS 25,000 ISSUES FIXED



The Eyes on Federal Way application reached the milestone last week of 25,000 issues fixed since its activation in December of 2020.

Eyes on Federal way assists in the reporting of potholes, abandoned shopping carts, garbage in the streets, or other local non-emergency problems that need attention, including a variety of other requests such as street maintenance, street light requests, downed trees, and other issues. The app uses GPS to recognize the user's location and provides a menu of common quality-of-life options to select from. It also allows the uploading of photos to accompany the request. Residents can also track the status of reports they or other members of the community have submitted. As always, residents may continue to call departments directly at City Hall for information on any municipal service and to report a problem within the city limits.



POLICE DEPARTMENT EMERGENCY VEHICLE OPERATIONS TRAINING

It is safe to say that there are many people who, at some point in their lives, would say they want to become a police officer. For some, the desire stemmed from a longing to help others. For others, the draw would be the perception that you can drive a car fast with lights and sirens going as an officer.




Every day, people watch as police cars navigate the roadways, maneuver around other motorists, continue through traffic control devices, and, yes, sometimes, drive fast! While the thought might sound exciting, the inherent risk and tremendous responsibility of driving even during routine vehicle operations is significant and is magnified when

officers respond to an emergency with their equipment activated.


Because of the risk and the responsibility of even routine driving, officers' skills must be adequate to operate safely for the citizens and coworkers. When officers are hired, part of the training they receive at the academy level includes training in emergency vehicle operations, commonly referred to as EVOC. The training prepares them with the skills they need to employ while operating a vehicle in all capacities as an officer. On top of the basic academy instruction that officers receive, the Federal Way Police Department has a team of EVOC instructors who provide ongoing training to their officers as the department tries to ensure the safety of the community at large.

EVOC TRAINING (continued)

While receiving training on **Pursuit Immobilization** Technique (PIT), officers are given instructions on the appropriate application of the PIT. Officers use The PIT maneuver on suspects who have fled from officers and for which they are authorized to pursue. The intent behind the PIT is to successfully conclude a pursuit as soon as possible, minimizing the inherent risk to the public, officers, and the suspect. Officers also get to perform



several PIT maneuvers in specially designed cars during this training as part of their certification, which is received at least every two years.



Officers are brought onto the race track for high speed training and provided with instruction on driving at higher speeds. They also discuss department policy and legal considerations when operating in an emergency. This training is a means to enhance the officers' abilities and identify each officer's capabilities and their vehicles limitations. Officers can test their skills as they navigate the closed course while instructors follow and provide individual direction. The goal is to show an increase in the safety level of officers as they operate in both a routine and emergency capacity.

There are many benefits to the department's EVOC training. In doing so, officers are better prepared for the various circumstances they

will encounter while operating a police vehicle, and the community will be safer all around. The ultimate goal is to ensure the safety of the community that we serve.






