ANNUAL SNOW AND ICE TRAINING

The City of Federal Way Public Works and Parks staff members came together at Celebration Park last week for our annual Snow and Ice Training. We are fortunate to have such a dedicated Public Works and Parks Departments serving our residents that will be working day and night in the event of inclement winter weather! At this event, staff go through safety trainings, perform vehicle inspections, practice with snow plows, and prepare other inclement weather equipment. This collaboration between Public Works and Parks en-



sures that when bad weather strikes the roads that can be promptly cleared, maintained and open for traffic. City crews perform ice prevention/ remediation and snow removal on all public road ways. Priority is given to major arterials (See link to Snow Removal Map below) with the highest traffic volumes, this allows for access for emergency services to the City. Remember, during inclement weather, the city is responsible for the roads and property owners are responsible for clearing the side walks! Please help us keep our roads and sidewalks free of snow and ice.

INCLEMENT WEATHER DRIVING SAFETY TIPS

Driving safely is important year-round, but with the wet months quickly approaching, the Federal Way Police Department is committed to helping you stay safe on the road. Wet weather often leads to accidents, but by following a few key precautions, you can reduce the risks. Even experienced drivers can find their skills challenged by slippery conditions.

• Check Your Vehicle: Ensure all lights are functioning properly and keep your windshields and mirrors clean for clear visibility. Make sure your tires are properly inflated and have adequate tread.

• Watch for Pedestrians: While we strongly encourage pedestrians and cyclists to wear reflective gear and stay alert, it's your responsibility to drive cautiously, as not everyone follows this advice.

• Be Cautious During Dusk:

Reduced visibility at dusk can be hazardous. Always turn on your headlights to improve visibility for yourself and others.

• Prevent Fatigue: Adjust to any time changes and make sure you're well-rested to avoid drowsy driving.

• Plan Your Trips: Whenever possible, drive during daylight hours and give yourself extra time to reach your destination safely.

• Avoid Distractions: Stay focused on the road, especially in low-light or wet conditions.

• Prepare for Changing Weather: Be ready for rain, fog, or other adverse weather that can impact visibility.

If your vehicle begins to slide, stay calm—don't slam on the brakes. Instead, steer in the direction you want to go and gently regain control.



Saturday, Jan. 25, 2025 – 7:00 pm



BIG BAND CONCERT II - A Journey through Time and Space







COVID-19 Testing

Order Your 4 Free At-home COVID-19 Tests

Every U.S. household is eligible to order 4 free at-home tests.

Every U.S. household may now order four free at-home COVID-19 tests at the following link: <u>https://special.usps.com/testkits</u> One of the available options is the Orasure InteliSwab test, which is more accessible for people who are blind or have low vision, as well as people who have low manual dexterity, at this link: <u>https://acl.gov/accessibletests</u>

These tests will detect the currently circulating COVID-19 variants and are intended for use through the end of 2024. The free tests are available through a partnership between the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response and the United States Postal Service. Many COVID-19 tests have extended expiration dates, so you may be able to use your COVID-19 tests after the expiration date that is printed on the box. To find out if your test has an extended expiration date, check the FDA's list of extended expiration dates at https://www.fda.gov/medical-devices/coronavirus-covid-19-and-medical-devices/home-otc-covid-19-diagnostic-tests
