POLICE RECRUITING IN WASHINGTON STATE

Have you ever wondered what it's like to be a recruit at a police academy in Washington State? After being hired, new officers attend the academy located in the Burien area. The training program lasts more than four months and involves approximately 720 hours of intensive instruction, combining classroom learning with hands-on practice. Here's a breakdown of the key areas covered in the curriculum:

Legal Studies: Recruits learn about criminal law, constitutional law, and the judicial system. Understanding these laws is essential for effective law enforcement.

Community Policing: This section focuses on building strong relationships within the community. Recruits practice effective communication and engagement strategies with diverse groups.



Investigative Techniques: Training

includes skills like evidence collection, crime scene processing, and interviewing witnesses, which are crucial for successful investigations.

Crisis Intervention: Recruits learn how to manage critical incidents, including mental health crises, and focus on techniques for de-escalating tense situations.

Physical Training: Daily conditioning prepares recruits for the physical demands of police work. This includes defensive tactics, firearms training, and emergency vehicle operations.



Ethics and Professionalism: Recruits study ethical decision-making and professional conduct, fostering integrity and accountability in their future roles. Throughout the program, recruits take quizzes and tests and participate in scenarios that require them to apply their knowledge in realistic situations. These scenarios are designed to mimic the types of incidents officers might face in the field, allowing recruits to practice their skills in a controlled setting. Recruits master key training areas such as traffic stops, domestic disputes, community interactions, high-risk encounters, crisis situations, and crime scene investigations.

Each scenario involves role playing and is closely monitored by instructors, who provide valuable feedback and guidance. By engaging in these realistic scenarios, recruits sharpen their decision-making skills, enhance their tactical responses, and build confidence before facing similar situations in their careers. SEA AIRPORT EXPANSION PUBLIC COMMENT **SESSION IN OUR CITY NOVEMBER 12**



SAMP PUBLIC COMN

The Puget Sound region is expected to grow by another one million people by 2035. The Sustainable Airport Master Plan (SAMP) is the blueprint for changes at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA) to meet future forecasted demand, SAMP identifies 31 Near-Term Projects (NTPs) that are intended to improve efficiency, safety, access to the airport, and support facilities for airlines and the airport. The NTPs, if approved, will be complete or under construction by 2032.

SAMP and the scoping process for the environmental review was completed in 2018. Currently, the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Environmental Assessment (EA) and 45-day public comment period is underway for SEA's SAMP recommended 31 NTPs.

At the conclusion of the comment period on December 5, 2024, all comments received will be reviewed and taken into consideration by the FAA and the Port during the preparation of the final NEPA EA. Responses to comments will be included in the final EA.

HOW TO COMMENT

Commenting on a draft EA is an important way for the public to participate in the environmental review process and contribute to the decision-making process. The Port is committed to an accessible, understandable public comment process. The public comment period is open from October 21 through December 5, 2024.

Members of the public will be able to review information translated into six languages and submit comments throughout the comment period at any of the public meetings listed below, online, by email, or regular mail. The document will be available on the SAMP website, at the SEA Airport Conference Center, and at public libraries in Burien, Des Moines, Federal Way, south Seattle, SeaTac, and Tukwila. Comments should provide sufficient detail for the agency to understand the commenter's position and why the issues raised are important to the decision-making process.




